Homebuilder confidence unchanged in April on mortgage rates

Shares of major homebuilders are dipping lower after the National Association of Home Builders (NAHB)/ Wells Fargo Housing Market Index (HMI) reported that Homebuilder Confidence for April remained unchanged from March. It currently sits at 51.

US single-family housing starts plunge in March

U.S. single-family homebuilding tumbled in March after hefty gains in the prior month, and while demand for housing remains strong, a resurgence in mortgage rates is pushing potential buyers to the sidelines.

Mortgage rates surge past 7%, reaching highest level since November

The 30-year fixed-rate mortgage averaged 7.10% in the week ending April 18, up from 6.88% the previous week, according to Freddie Mac data released Thursday. A year ago, the average 30-year fixed-rate was 6.39%.

US home sales dropped last month as March prices reached a record high

Existing home sales, which make up the majority of the housing market, fell 4.3% in March to a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 4.19 million, the sharpest drop in more than a year, the National Association of Realtors reported Thursday. Sales fell across the country except in the Northeast region, which saw an increase for the first time since November 2023.

High mortgage rates are finally hitting new home construction as builders are pulling back on projects

The housing crisis in America is multifaceted. Prospective home buyers are reluctant to buy, given sky-high mortgage rates and home pricesand for the same reason, current homeowners have shied away from selling. But there is also a massive housing crunch; the U.S. is short 3 million to 6 million homes. (Subscription may be required.)

Something deeply unusual has happened in the American housing market over the last two years, as mortgage rates have risen to around 7 percent. Rates that high are not, by themselves, historically remarkable. The trouble is that the average American household with a mortgage is sitting on a fixed rate that is a whopping three points lower. STRETCH CODES

The state is closely watching potential building code changes, in particular "Strech Codes:"

The Montana Department of Labor and Industry's (MDLI) proposed updates to the state building code include several positive changes to the building codes, including incorporating the 2021 International Energy Conservation Code and allowing local jurisdictions to implement certain "stretch codes;' in addition to the base code. For example, MDLI's proposed rules allow certified jurisdictions to adopt solar-ready residential codes (meaning new construction electrical systems and roofs must be ready to accommodate solar), solar-ready commercial zones, and zero-energy commercial code provisions (requiring new commercial buildings to offset energy consumption with renewable energy). These stretch codes would allow ambitious communities to use local government powers to accelerate the clean energy transition. However, the proposed amendments do not allow stretch codes for residential buildings. Given that residential buildings are the most common and use the most aggregate energy

CITY OF MISSOULA INITIATES A STUDY TO DETERMINE THE FEASIBILITY OF STRETCH CODES

The City of Missoula on March 5, 2024, adopted a resolution to: " ... determine the feasibility and if practical, facilitate the development of an incentive based voluntary stretch energy building code that can be adopted within 12 months or in alignment with the next local adoption of state energy building codes:' While this resolution will initiate discussions on the feasibility of adopting stretch codes, the resolution goes on to state: " ... the Missoula City Council supports the creation of a Stretch Energy Code for residential and commercial building construction that allows for a public process to address recommended actions:' Resolution 8250, City of Missoula. https://www.ci.missoula.mt. us/DocumentCenter/View/42847/Resolution-8250?bidid=

MISSOULA COUNTY TOPICS

The City-County Health Department has placed a 2024, moratorium on groundwater monitoring to allow septic systems due to a low snowpack.

County-wide impact fees go into effect on July 1, 2024. The new impact fees are Focus on general government facilities, public safety (sheriff, Detention center, emergency response, new radio systems and emergency broadcasting, parks improvements to existing parks (not new parks), and to existing trails.

Commissioner Josh Slotnick has made a commitment to inform Missoula County Residents on property tax and property tax reform. Josh will present "Property Tax 101" May 10, 2024, from noon to 1 pm at WGM Groups' Office at 1111 East Broadway. If you would like to attend let Ryan Salisbury PE, know. - a. Assessment and computation of property taxes
